TEACHING PHILOSOPHY

My general approach to teaching is partly inspired by an assertion from theatre director and teacher Anne Bogart, who writes in her book A Director Prepares that "...you cannot create results. You can only create conditions in which something might happen." While she is referring primarily to theatre directing, I have adopted this same philosophy as a core tenet of my teaching. Rather than attempting to "create results," I focus on creating conditions under which learning can happen. To this end, I keep in mind four basic

outcomes when designing courses. By the end of students' time with me, I hope they are able to: (a) access and utilize a wide range of educational resources from a variety of perspectives, (b) take ownership of, and become personally invested in, their own education, (c) recognize their individual accountability for community success, and (d) learn to collaborate with peers of diverse backgrounds and identities.
